

The Iowa Family and Consumer Sciences Educators held their fall meeting on Saturday, Oct. 7, 2017 in the Palmer Building on the Iowa State campus.

President Courtney Tegtmeyer called the meeting to order and gave a welcome and introductions. Minutes of the past meeting held this summer at Ames was distributed by Secretary Sherry Vogel. Nancy Johnson made a motion to approve with a second from Vicki Sogard.

Treasurer Lisa Breyfogle was unable to attend but sent documents stated the budget. Balance as of Fall meeting on 10-7-17 is \$6008.35. Note that \$1000 is budgeted for National Policy Seminar with \$500 each to student and teacher. Budget was approved prior at summer conference. Audit on budget was done by a business teacher.

Lisa Stange, DE, gave a report on the model program and is looking at a year end to finish this. The National Governor's Association is sponsoring apprenticeships. Lisa reminded everyone of the deadline for CTE Presidential Scholar awards and the National Policy Seminar. Lisa also explained the timeline for the RPP work.

Troy Anderson, ISU, report there are 94 enrolled in the FCS program which is a 50% increase from last year. They now have partnerships with other states for student teaching. 7 are working on licensure at this time with 11 student teaching in the spring. Iowa State FCSEd. Students spoke about their roles. They are working on philanthropy this year with 30 in the club. They have done various projects already this year.

Laura VanWaardhuizen gave the IACTE report on the regional conference held in June and also the IACTE conference which was held this past September. National conference will be held Dec. 6-9. RPP money may be used to attend this conference. Lisa Stange is running for regional vice president.

Timothy Marx reported for FCCLA. In 2017 Iowa membership was down. Timothy reported that there were schools saying they have FCCLA but not affiliating. Blank Children's Hospital is again the service projects selected for this year. FCCLA is trying to reach a \$10,000 goal. 90 members attended the National Leadership Conference this past summer. 3 advisers were recognized with awards. National office is giving states money for red jackets. Iowa received around \$5,000 for this. 398 attended the fall rally recently with a focus on Peer Education at the meeting. There is a new STAR Event entitled Say Yes to FCS. The board approved hiring a Competitive Events Coordinator with the deadline of Oct. 18 to apply.

Laura and Courtney explained the APEX program which is a partnership with businesses. They are also working to improve the IFCSE website. Members are asked to email Laura with what they would like to see on the website for promotion and ideas.

Sherry Vogel reported on scholarship. Would like more ISU students to apply. Money from auction and also sales from Florida Fruit Association will again be used for the scholarship.

Julie Schreiber reported on IFCSE Awards. Several of our award winners were recognized at IACTE. She encouraged more to apply for our awards.

There was no old business.

New Business: Conference Coordinator Contract.

The DE and IFCSE split the cost on this. The DE will now only provide \$2500 for this contract. Former contract was for \$6000.00. Kendra Ganson made a motion to keep the contract at \$6000 with Julie Schreiber seconding with an added amendment that Krisitie must let us know by Dec. 31, 2017 if she plans to give up this job for next year and that a check and membership list must be given to the treasurer by one month after the annual conference. Motion passed.

Kristie Kuhse reported on the 2017 conference. 143 IFCSE members and 13 AAFCS members attended along with 14 ISU students. Kristie gave highlights from the evaluations from members. The conference budget sheet was explained. Total expenses were \$30,893.36. Ending balance is \$32,574.06. CD will mature on 3/25/18.

The 2018 conference discussion was held with a mock up of what it would look like. Conference will be held on Sunday, August 5 through August 7. Sherry Vogel, Julie Schreiber, and Lisa Koenence will work on a Sunday evening break out box session. Suggestions were given for break out sessions. If anyone has ideas, please forward to Kristie. An emphasis was put on having a track of options with careers, FCCLA, Financial Literacy, Culinary/Hospitality, and Child Dev/Human Services.

Committee sign up for key leaders will happen with a google document. Committees are scholarship, awards, legislative, annual goals, audit/budget, and merchandise. The chairperson of each committee stated what they did in the committee. In the interest of time, we will start with committee work at the spring meeting.

There was a fund request for a student and teacher to attend the National Policy Seminar which is March 5-7, 2018 in Washington, DC. This is up to \$1000. Sherry Vogel motioned to pay this and Kelsie Engelken seconded. Motion passed.

Also student representatives are needed for advocacy for the school counselors' conference, the Iowa School Board conference, and CTE Day at the Capitol. Teachers should email Sandy Miller if any schools are interested in participating in these days.

Date of the next meeting is March 3. An executive meeting will also be held then.

Vicki Sogard moved to adjourn the meeting with a second from Kendra Ganson. Motion passed.
